The new mower purchased from AGrowQuip Ltd was delivered on Friday the 22nd April

during a lovely weather break that allowed a good close inspection and great discussions by our members and Peter Wright present. This purchase was made possible with a \$25000 grant from The Lions Foundation, past members fund raising efforts and a \$10000 donation from a member who wishes to remain anonymous. The club is extremely grateful for such a generous gesture. Past Committees have worked hard at building up the funds and have contributed to placing the club into such a strong position for the long term future of the club.



This diesel mower has 3 cutters driven by electric motors and something like 102 fewer



hydraulic points so it is really the lifter only that is hydraulically driven. The cruise control setting should reduce the diesel consumption and it should also operate more quietly. It also has ridged stainless steel rollers as opposed to the wooden ones on the old mower. The costs of these mowers have already risen across the board and the 2500 hydraulic version is much more expensive now. We will be placing the old

mower and the verti-cut attachments for sale in the marketplace soon.
